The Research Project ICCAP - Impact of Climate Changes on Agricultural Production System in Arid Areas - is one of five first pioneer research projects of the Research Institute for Humanity and Nature (RIHN), which were launched in 2002. The ICCAP selected the Seyhan River Basin in Turkey as a main case study area, and then it is being implemented as an international joint research project in cooperation with TÜBİTAK (The Scientific and Technical Research Council of Turkey). At the end of second year of the project, March 2004, we have summarized the research progress of sub-groups and individual topics and publish them as the Interim Report.

This volume contains the interim reports from sub-groups and participants with overview of the progress of the whole project. Finally, we would like to appreciate all participants of ICCAP for their efforts and contributions and we believe they enjoy the joint research and the project comes up to the expectations of RIHN, TUBITAK and all concerning groups. We also want to express our special thanks to our colleagues of RIHN for secretarial works and for editing this volume.
